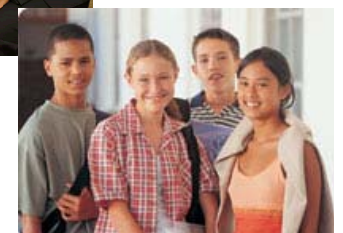

Incorporated in 2004, the Grady Young Foundation was formed in memory of Grady Young, a devout Christian and active, dedicated, loyal citizen of Gainesville-Hall County, Georgia. To honor the work ethic and commitment of Mr. Young and his family, the Foundation established the Grady Young Foundation Book Scholarships.



In 2005, the Foundation implemented four distinct memorial scholarships in memory of Grady Young, his wife, Eloise Mosley Young, and his two deceased daughters, Irene Young Johnson and Marie Young Johnson. These

scholarships are awarded each year to graduating high school seniors in Gainesville-Hall County and other related communities.

Scholarships

Grady Young Foundation Book Scholarship is awarded to a graduating high school senior from each of the high schools within the Gainesville-Hall County Public School Systems. The amount of each scholarship is \$250.

Grady Young Memorial Scholarship is awarded to a graduating high school senior residing in Gainesville-Hall County or other related communities. The amount of this scholarship varies from \$1,000 to \$3,000 maximum pending available funds.

Eloise Mosley Young Memorial Scholarship is awarded to a graduating high school senior who will attend Savannah State University in Savannah, Georgia. The amount of this scholarship is \$1,000.

Irene Young Johnson Memorial Scholarship is awarded to a graduating high school senior residing in Gainesville-Hall County or other related communities. The amount of this scholarship is \$500.

Marie Young Johnson Memorial Scholarship is awarded to a graduating high school senior who is a relative of Grady or Eloise Young. The amount of this scholarship is \$500.

Gaynell B. Young Williams Memorial Scholarship is awarded to a graduating high school senior or a continuing education student who is a member of Cross Plains Missionary Baptist Church. The amount of this scholarship is \$500.

Marion "Paulette" Lott Memorial Scholarship is awarded to a graduating high school senior who has earned at least ten (10) hours of active Community Service within the current school year, submitted a type-written 500 to 1,000 word Essay on "What I love about American History", provide one recommendation from a school official of current school, and meet all requirements of the GYF Scholarship Program. The amount of this scholarship is \$1,000 pending available funds.

Incentive scholarships will be awarded pending available funds.

Tips For Submitting Application

DOWNLOAD the application from www.gradyyoungfoundation.org

READ all instructions and related information **thoroughly**.

FOLLOW ALL INSTRUCTIONS. Get clarification from your School contact person(s) or the Grady Young Foundation, if you have questions.

DO NOT WAIT until the "last minute." Prepare your application and request necessary documents (e.g. certifications, recommendations) well in advance of the deadline (March 1 of each award year).

GIVE YOUR ESSAY A TITLE and include it on your *typed* essay.

IDENTIFY YOURSELF. Be sure your name or other specified means of identification is on each page submitted.

RETAIN A COPY of all submitted documents for your records.

RETAIN PROOF OF MAILING. If you mail application via the United States Postal Service, retain a receipt as proof your application was mailed by the **deadline of March 1 of each award year.**
