Scholarship Program Overview

Incorporated in 2004, the Grady Young Foundation was formed in memory of Grady Young, a devout Christian and active, dedicated, loyal citizen of Gainesville-Hall County, Georgia. To honor the work ethic and commitment of Mr. Young and his family, the Foundation established the Grady Young Foundation Book Scholarships, making them available to each Gainesville/Hall County High School.



In 2005, the Foundation implemented four distinct memorial scholarships in memory of Grady Young, his wife, Eloise Mosley Young, and his two deceased daughters, Irene Young Johnson and Marie Young Johnson. These scholarships are awarded each year to

graduating high school seniors in Gainesville-Hall County and other related communities. These scholarships, in addition to five (5) others, are awarded each year to graduating high school seniors or continuing education undergraduate students in Gainesville/Hall County and other related communities.



Scholarships

Grady Young Foundation Book Scholarship: Awarded to Gainesville/Hall County High School Graduating Seniors Only. Amount of Award: Up to \$300.

Grady Young Memorial Scholarship: Awarded to Gainesville/Hall County High School Graduating Seniors Gainesville/Hall County Resident. Amount of Award: Up to \$1,500.

Eloise Mosley Young Memorial Scholarship: Awarded to Graduating Senior attending Savannah State University. Amount of Award: Up to \$1,000 .

Irene Young Johnson Memorial Scholarship: Awarded to a Graduating Senior. Amount of Award: Up to \$500.

Marie Young Johnson Memorial Scholarship: Awarded to a Graduating Senior. Amount of Award: Up to \$500.

Gaynell B. Young Williams Memorial Scholarship: Awarded to: Graduating Senior or Continuing Education Undergraduate Student Active Member of his/her Church. Amount of Award: Up to \$500.

Marion "Paulette" Lott Memorial Scholarship: Awarded to: Graduating Senior with 10 Active Hours of Community Service within current school year and a 500 to 1000 Word Essay submitted on "What I love About American History." Amount of Award: Up to \$1,000.

Gerald Franklin Kesler Memorial Scholarship: Awarded to: Graduating Senior or Continuing Education Undergraduate Student maintaining a 3.000 GPA, 25 Active Hours of Community Service within current school year, and a 500 to 1,000 Word Essay submitted on "Building My Community." Amount of Award: Up to \$500.

Jacob Wilmont Community Athletic Scholarship: Awarded to: Graduating Senior who has participated in the Gainesville/Hall County Boys and Girls Club Program . Amount of Award: Up to \$500.

Estelle Mosley Young Jackson Memorial Book Scholarship: Awarded to: Graduating Senior Intended Major: Education. Amount of Award: Up to \$250.

Incentive scholarships will be awarded pending available funds.

FOLLOW ALL INSTRUCTIONS. If you have questions, get clarification from your School contact person(s) or the Grady Young Foundation.

DO NOT WAIT until the "last minute." Prepare your application and necessary documents (e.g. certifications, recommendations) well in advance of the deadline (March 1 of each award year).

GIVE YOUR ESSAY A TITLE and include it on your *typed* essay submission.

IDENTIFY YOURSELF. Be sure your name or other specified means of identification is on each page submitted.

RETAIN A COPY of all submitted documents for your records.

RETAIN PROOF OF MAILING. If you mail application via the United States Postal Service, retain a receipt as proof your application was mailed by the **deadline of March 1** of each award year.
