Scholarship Program Overview

Incorporated in 2004, the Grady Young Foundation was formed in memory of Grady Young, a devout Christian and active, dedicated, loyal citizen of Gainesville-Hall County, Georgia. To honor the work ethic and commitment of Mr. Young and his family, the Foundation established the Grady Young Foundation Book Scholarships, making them available to each Gainesville/Hall County High School.



In 2005, the Foundation implemented four distinct memorial scholarships in memory of Grady Young, his wife, Eloise Mosley Young, and his two deceased daughters, Irene Young Johnson and Marie Young Johnson. These scholarships are awarded each year to

graduating high school seniors in Gainesville-Hall County and other related communities. These scholarships, in addition to others, are awarded each year to graduating high school seniors or continuing education undergraduate students in Gainesville/Hall County and other related communities.



Scholarships

Grady Young Foundation Book Scholarship: Awarded to Gainesville/Hall County High School Graduating Seniors Only. Amount of Award: Up to \$500.

Grady Young Memorial Scholarship: Awarded to Gainesville/Hall County High School Graduating Seniors Gainesville/Hall County Resident. Amount of Award: Up to \$1,500.

Charles G. Young Chairman's Leadership Scholarship: Awarded to two (2) high school seniors or continuing education students inclusively noting leadership achievements. One student must attend Savannah State University. Amount of Award: Each scholarship \$1,000 annually.

Eloise Mosley Young Memorial Scholarship: Awarded to Graduating Senior attending Savannah State University. Amount of Award: Up to \$1,000.

Irene Young Johnson Memorial Scholarship: Awarded to a Graduating Senior. Amount of Award: Up to \$1,000.

Marie Young Johnson Memorial Scholarship: Awarded to a Graduating Senior. Amount of Award: Up to \$500.

Gaynell B. Young Williams Memorial Scholarship: Awarded to: Graduating Senior or Continuing Education Undergraduate Student Active Member of his/her Church. Amount of Award: Up to \$500.

Marion "Paulette" Lott Memorial Scholarship: Awarded to: Graduating Senior with 10 Active Hours of Community Service within current school year and a 500 to 1000 Word Essay submitted on "What I love About American History." Amount of Award: Up to \$1,000.

Gerald Franklin Kesler Memorial Scholarship: Awarded to: Graduating Senior or Continuing Education Undergraduate Student maintaining a 3.000 GPA, 25 Active Hours of Community Service within current school year, and a 500 to 1,000 Word Essay submitted on "Building My Community." Amount of Award: Up to \$500.

Willie B. Young & Sons Memorial Scholarship: Awarded to a graduating high school senior in pursuit of a Business degree. Must have a 3.0 GPA, participate in extra-curricular activities, community service, be an American Citizen, and submit a 500-1,000 word essay on "How am I going to Change the World with my Business Degree?" Amount of Award: Up to \$500.

Scholarships

Estelle Mosley Young Jackson Memorial Book Scholarship: Awarded to: Graduating Senior Intended Major: Education. Amount of Award: Up to \$500.

Jacob Wilmont Community Athletic Scholarship: Awarded to: Graduating Senior who has participated in the Gainesville/Hall County Boys and Girls Club Program. Amount of Award: Up to \$500.

John O. & Eunice C. Davis Scholarship: Awarded to a graduating high school senior or continuing education student. Amount of Award: Up to \$500.

Sarah Dillard Legacy Builder Scholarship: Awarded to a male or female, fulltime student enrolled at Savannah State University majoring in Civil Engineering, maintaining a 3.0 GPA. Amount of Award: \$500 (\$250 fall/spring semester).

Dr. Virginia Juanita Young Morrison Advocate Scholarship Awarded to a graduating high school senior or continuing education undergraduate. Must meet all GYF scholarship criteria and 25 hours of community service during current school year and/or have a diagnosed disability (physician's diagnosis must accompany). Amount of Award: \$1,000 annually.

Elzonia Williams Memorial Scholarship Awarded to a Single Mother, using the GYF general scholarship criteria for all Graduate and Undergraduate student applicants. \$500 annually.

Samuel Eugene Williams Memorial Scholarship Awarded using the GYF general scholarship criteria for all Graduate and Undergraduate student applicants. \$500 annually.

Incentive scholarships will be awarded pending available funds.
